Thank you for your support in helping San Antonio Pets Alive! march forward in our mission to make San Antonio a "lifesaving" community. We are grateful for the generosity of our fosters, donors, adopters, and supporters, and we are excited to head into 2023.

Our mission is a challenging one, but we continue to utilize our resources, leaning on the kindness and support of our valued donors and

supporters, as we dedicate ourselves to rescuing one precious life at a time. Despite this past year being difficult with the increasing number of Code Reds and the state of our economy, we had many successes, thanks to the help of supporters like you.

2022 Highlights

- Saved nearly 4,800 at-risk dogs and cats from euthanasia. This is an INCREASE over 2021!!
- Increased adoptions by 22%, resulting in 3,531 adoptions in 2022. We partnered with local businesses to host adoption events, and sought out additional community partners willing to host and help us market animals searching for a pet parent.
- Secured funding to purchase an X-ray machine for our medical clinic, giving our medical staff more resources to diagnose and treat our sick and injured animals. This allows San Antonio Pets Alive! to save time and money, as we can do more assessments in-house at our medical facility.
- Hired key staff positions to make us a stronger rescue group. This has allowed us to free up other
 dedicated staff members and volunteers, allowing them to focus on what they do best, and allowing us
 to become more efficient in our rescue efforts. We now have our very own animal behaviorist on staff
 helping our dogs and cats have the best chance in finding forever families.
- Created a detailed strategic plan and this plan will help to guide our efforts over the next three years.

From the bottom of our hearts, and the hearts of those animals we saved with your help, we sincerely thank you. We have a long way to go, and there is much work to be done, but every day we are so very grateful that our community partners are willing to step up to help us care for the tiniest lives that can't speak for themselves.


OUR IMPACT

SAPA! At Work


SAPA! offers a range of programming across four sites, including Adoption, Foster, Owner Surrender, Medical Care Center, and Placement. Together, these programs allowed SAPA! to save thousands of dogs and cats each year. The graph below shows the number of animals rescued, transferred, and/ or adopted from 2017 to 2022. The dip in transfers and spike in fosters during 2020 is due in large part to the closures and homebound nature of the COVID-19 pandemic.





MEDICAL UPDATES

Thank you to our generous supporters for helping cover the medical care for many of our cats and dogs. Because of you, these animals received the medical care urgently needed and successfully recovered from their injuries and illnesses.

Bonnie



In June 2022, one of our staff members saw Bonnie Blue Eyes at the city shelter and quickly stepped up to foster her. Bonnie was found with her mouth bound shut. Aged at about five months old and weighing in at only SIX pounds, underneath all her fur was skin and bones. She was lethargic, too weak to walk or stand, and had an upper respiratory infection. During the first few weeks, Bonnie had many overnight stays at a vet clinic due to her fragile state.

Though the beginning of her life was very touch and go, we are thrilled that today, this spunky and smart little pup is loving life with her wonderful foster family, who decided they could not let her go and adopted her! Thank you for rooting for and supporting her through this journey. Bonnie has even traveled the country with her family and is now residing in her new home in Tennessee.

Potter





Potter (aka Allen) was brought into SAPA!'s care with a horrible burn wound on his back. Potter's wound was carefully cleaned with saline daily and was examined closely by our medical team and his foster until the wound completely healed.

A loving family fell in love with Potter's gentle and sweet personality and adopted him this past September. His new family wrote, "Potter is doing great! He has a 10-year-old sister dog named Onyx. They get along great! He also has two human brothers that love him dearly. We never thought we were a two dog family but here we are loving it & loving him."

Salt



Salt came into our care this past August with her sister, Vinegar. They both were severely underweight, dehydrated, and suffered horrible upper respiratory and eye infections. Due to the severity, they both needed enucleations, removal of one of their eyes.

Today, they are thriving with their forever families. Salt's mom wrote, "We love our Salty Baby! She has acclimated well and has made fast friends with everyone here but her favorite is our Dachshund rescue, Peanut. She's filled a void in our hearts after losing a favorite feline. What a great kitty she is and we adore her!"

FOSTER PROGRAM

Fosters are the heart and soul of SAPA!. The number of animals we save depends entirely on the number of people who open their hearts and homes to foster them. SAPA! is a foster-based rescue organization and relies on the community to save thousands of lives each year.

Foster Spotlights

Staycation



Justine and her husband received an email from our foster team about Stellar needing a foster. Since they have a dog who can be a little grumpy with other dogs, they decided to try out Stellar in their home through SAPA!'s staycation program.

When they introduced their dogs to Stellar, they immediately loved her, even their grumpy pup. "The first night we had planned for her to sleep in her crate, but before we even made it into our bed Stellar was already comfortably cuddled up under the blanket and our dogs were lying next to her. We knew it was meant to be for her to be our new foster and not just our staycation pup. Stellar found a really amazing home

and she now has a dog sister named Robyn. I couldn't have asked for better! The staycation program gave us the opportunity to take it slow and be sure that our grumpy pup is comfortable with a new dog in the home."

Sunkist and her puppies were on the city shelter's euthanasia list and running out of time. Thankfully Peggy, a foster, offered to take them in until they were ready for adoption. The pups were all adopted in April, and Sunkist was adopted in June after she completed her heartworm treatment! Peggy wrote, "Despite the bumps in the road, they went to successful families full of love, families they so very much deserve."

Neonatal Kittens



Comet came into SAPA!'s care with his three siblings when they were just three weeks old. It was clear from the start he was a little different – lagging behind his siblings in growth and coordination.

Subsequently, Comet was diagnosed with Cerebellar Hypoplasia, sometimes called "wobbly cat syndrome." This was causing his unsteadiness, but it doesn't progress over time or cause pain. During this time, Comet's siblings had already been adopted and moved into their forever homes. Luckily, the family that adopted one of his brothers and his sister reached out to set up a meeting with Comet after hearing

about his story, and it was love at first sight! Comet has since thrived in his new home with his siblings, and with a few accommodations, he has grown to be the biggest of the three. You could hardly tell he has a wobble at all!

Cat Foster of The Year



"Rescue pets are special. They've been through so much, and when

they find their person, they seem to understand that their life is going to change for the better. It was almost like Boo knew instinctively that we are both disabled and that we need each other equally...because I had been through a lot too."

For Crystal, the connection with Boo was immediate. He sleeps with her every night, and although Crystal can't move around as easily as she would like, Boo always seems to know when a cuddle is needed. "When we are together and feel his purr, I know that he's happy which makes me feel more at ease which is nice especially after a rough day."

Crystal says that her advice to anyone who may be struggling right now is "just to keep trying to be your best self every day, no matter what. Remember to celebrate the good days, be kind to others, and know that love comes in all forms."

Ameritas


Corporate Volunteer of The Year

ABOUT SAN ANTONIO PETS ALIVE!

San Antonio Pets Alive! is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization. Due to alarming euthanasia rates, San Antonio Pets Alive! (SAPA!) was founded in 2011. SAPA! is unique—it is the only high paced, high-volume rescue in San Antonio, saving approximately 5,000 at-risk cats and dogs annually.
